


18 Holes not 800 Houses Have Your Say! Save Your Golf Course

What Could You Say?

- **1**) Golfers want to play 18 holes, not 9
 - Save the NHS Play Golf! it keeps people physically and mentally healthy.
 - Ageing population and increased leisure time demand for Golf will grow.
 - Horsham Golf is a short distance from Horsham Town and is affordably priced.
 - Horsham Hockey may want a home but not at the expense of Golfers. Other sites, better connected to the town, are currently available for Hockey.
 - A 9 hole pitch and putt is unlikely to be economically viable with a Phase 2 Housing development inevitable.
 - A meaningful "Golf College" needs 18 holes, not a 9 hole pitch and putt.
- Development at Horsham Golf would be a watershed move towards the coalescence of the built-up areas of Southwater and Horsham
- Any Development at Horsham Golf would put additional stress on the already overburdened local infrastructure schools, doctors, dentists etc.
- Increased traffic will cause congestion and further compromise safety on what is already a dangerous route into town for cyclists and pedestrians
- This development would have a major detrimental impact on Denne Hill, an iconic and easily accessible Green Space for Horsham Residents and home to many rare and protected fauna and flora.
